Statement

The Park District of Oak Park Scholarship Program exists to provide programs and services to our residents who might otherwise financially not be able to participate. Sources of funding include \$8,000 from the Township of Oak Park, non-resident fees, patron donations, and other fundraising initiatives. An additional \$5,000 in YES funds (Youth Engagement Scholarship from Oak Park – River Forest Community Foundation) were contributed specifically toward Summer Camp registration fees for current recipients but the registration details for the YES scholarship are not included in this report. The amount of scholarship funds redeemed in 2019, totaled \$71,432.37 compared to \$67,057.14 in 2018. To promote our scholarship program to adults and seniors, applications were hand delivered to several low income housing facilities, the Township offices, as well as the Oak Housing Center and Oak Park Residence Corporation.

Criteria for 2019 scholarship eligibility remained the same as it did in 2018.

- \$300 maximum funding for each qualified family member.
- No household maximum.
- Registrations can take place any time throughout the year.
- 3 tiers of financial qualification exist. (Tier 1 provides 75% funding; Tier 2 provides 55% funding; and Tier 3 provides 35% funding towards program and pass fees.)


Discussion

A total of 72 (73 in 2018) households were new to the scholarship program out of 222 (206 in 2018) approved applications for 2019 program. 511 unique individuals within those households used the scholarship (464 in 2018). Out of these 206 households, 7% qualified at Tier 3 (35%), 14% qualified at Tier 2 (55% income level) and the remaining 79% qualified at Tier 1 (75% level). 16 of these households did not follow through and register for any programs or services in 2019 after being approved. Scholarship recipients received funding toward a total of 1,229 (1,179 in 2017) programs and passes in 2019.



Statement

The annual Field Utilization Report has been prepared summarizing the field usage for 2019. The 2012 Athletic Field Study provided a baseline on number of program hours that could be supported on both grass and turf fields. This study has served as a guide for updating and improving all Park District of Oak Park (PDOP) athletic field spaces.

Discussion

The Field Utilization Report serves to inform the Park District Board of Commissioners as well as the public of the PACT affiliate groups usage of Park District fields. It also serves a tool to adjust usage to better maintain playing conditions throughout the system. The installation of four (4) synthetic turf surfaces used by the PODP has helped to shift play and better maintain the grass fields.
